The Whitney M. Young Leadership Initiative is comprised of three developmental programs designed to maximize the potential of each scholar.

- **1. Whitney M. Young Scholars Program:** This foundational college preparatory program offers a rigorous educational framework for students in grades 8-12 fostering academic excellence and lifelong learning.
- **2. College Transition Enrichment Program:** As scholars transition from high school to college, this program provides seamless mentoring and guidance through the entire college experience. Support is provided to ensure students maintain their scholarships and progress successfully toward degree attainment.
- **3. Future Leaders Internship Program:** This final phase offers invaluable practical experience and mentorship, equipping participants with the skills to embark upon a career to grow our local workforce talent pool.

### Whitney M. Young Scholars Take Part in Honoring the Legacy of Eckstein Norton

On October 19, a significant event in Bullitt County, KY, celebrated Eckstein Norton University's enduring legacy. This gathering brought together Lincoln Foundation staff, Whitney M. Young Scholars, descendants of Eckstein Norton, the Kentucky Historical Society, and local officials. A

historical marker was unveiled to commemorate the university's pivotal role in advancing African American education post-Civil War.

Five Whitney M. Young Scholars took part in the ceremony, highlighting the link between the present and the past. Forty Norton descendants traveled from places as far away as Paris, France, to pay tribute to their ancestor's impact in supporting education.

Discovered by Gary and Kathy Fields on their farm in Cane Springs, Ky., the remnants of Eckstein Norton University rekindled interest in its historical significance. Founded in 1890, the school provided primary education up to college-level degrees that transformed Kentucky's educational landscape

for formerly enslaved African Americans.

Lincoln Foundation traces part of its heritage to Eckstein Norton University. Gerry Tyrrell, a Norton descendant, expressed pride in his family's educational legacy, emphasizing its continued impact through Lincoln Foundation's work with under-resourced Kentucky students.

To perpetuate this legacy, Norton's descendants endowed a scholarship with \$100,000. It will be awarded each year to a deserving scholar ensuring that Eckstein Norton's passion for education continues to inspire future generations.
