Adria Johnson

President & CEO, Metro United Way


Adria Johnson embodies the virtues of hope, integrity, and humanity. She has focused her career on lifting some of society's most vulnerable populations and serving others. She is a dedicated and well-respected servant leader with almost three decades of hands-on experience in public and private sectors. Ms. Johnson's proven ability to lead efforts toward reform and work collaboratively have served her well in her current position as President and Chief Executive Officer for Metro United Way.

Her compassionate leadership has resulted in providing expanded human services in neighborhood revitalization supports, preventive services for at-risk youth, and comprehensive services for children with greater behavioral and developmental needs. Additionally, Ms. Johnson has worked to provide employment opportunities for youth aging out of foster care, and to develop workforce opportunities for social services disciplines.

Before joining Metro United Way, Ms. Johnson served as Commissioner and Deputy Commissioner of the Kentucky Department for Community-Based Services. Before serving in state government, Ms. Johnson held key roles in Louisville Metro Government ranging from Capital Planning Analyst in the Office of Management and Budget to Acting Director of the Department of Community Services and Revitalization. Early in her career, Ms. Johnson gained strong fiscal experience working in the private sector at Brown and Williamson, Humana, and LG&E.

Adria Johnson has been recognized as one of Louisville's most admired CEOs by Business-First and was included in 2024's Power 50 list as one of the most influential leaders in our community. In 2023, she was celebrated as a Daughter of Greatness by the Muhammad Ali Center.

Ms. Johnson received her bachelor's degree from Ball State University and completed several post-graduate courses at the University of Louisville. She is a published author, with a book of poetry released in 2004. She is a native of Louisville, has a daughter, and three precious grandchildren. Ms. Johnson's son, Kenneth Rhodes II, tragically passed away in late 2022, but his legacy continues to inspire and fuel her efforts.

Each year, Lincoln Foundation honors a Whitney M. Young Scholar with the prestigious Dr. Samuel Robinson Award of Excellence, recognizing outstanding commitment to the college-readiness program. The award is named in honor of Dr. Samuel Robinson, President Emeritus, who created the Whitney M. Young Scholars Program in 1990. Scholars earn points based on academic performance, attendance, and active engagement. The senior scholar with the highest number of points earned receives this prestigious award.

Lincoln Foundation and Baird are pleased to present Juan Hernandez Trejo with the 2025 Dr. Samuel Robinson Award of Excellence! In addition, he will receive the Educational Opportunity Scholarship that includes a \$5,000 annually renewable scholarship totaling \$20,000. Juan may also receive up to \$2,500 each year to cover the cost of computers, technology, and other supplies. Finally, the Educational Opportunity Scholarship will award Juan up to \$10,000 for study abroad.

Juan Hernandez Trejo has proven to be a driven and accomplished student at Butler Traditional High School, excelling academically and as a leader in various extracurricular activities. A dedicated member of the Whitney M. Young Scholars Program since seventh grade, Juan is committed to academic excellence, leadership, and personal growth.

Throughout high school, he has taken on multiple leadership roles, including serving as treasurer of Future Business Leaders of America, team captain of his high school archery team, and Commonwealth sponsor at the Kentucky Youth Assembly. Juan's bill, promoting sign language instruction in high schools across Kentucky, passed both the House and Senate in December 2024. He participates in Future Health Professionals, Beta Club, National Honor Society, tennis, and the yearbook committee. He has further distinguished himself by earning twenty-one college credit hours and a 4.14 weighted cumulative GPA.

Juan serves as a Baptist Health emergency room volunteer, where he has gained firsthand insight into the fast-paced environment of emergency medicine. This has solidified his desire to pursue a career as a certified registered nurse anesthetist. He plans to earn a nursing degree at the University of Louisville before advancing to a nurse anesthesia graduate program. Juan's bilingual skills, commitment to patient care, and dedication to excellence will be instrumental in helping him make a significant impact on the future of healthcare.





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## THE WHITNEY M. YOUNG Leadership Initiative

Whitney M. Young Leadership Initiative empowers underrepresented youth in Louisville by fostering college readiness and college success. Our mission is to dismantle barriers to higher education through academic excellence, personal growth, and resilience. We equip scholars to overcome social and economic disadvantages and achieve academically leading to a successful transition into college and embarking on a career. We develop first-generation college graduates for the benefit of the students, their families, and our community.

The Whitney M. Young Leadership Initiative consists of three programs:

**The Whitney M. Young Scholars Program (WYSP)** provides support from 8th grade to high school graduation. Students participate in Saturday morning outside-of-school sessions that include academic support, guidance, and rigorous college preparatory curricula. The scholars' parents or guardians attend monthly Parental Institutes to gain the resources and knowledge needed to better support their students in the college selection process.



provides continued support as students transition from high school to college. The program provides guidance, mentoring, and other support services throughout the college experience. Services include course scheduling, financial aid, tutoring, housing support, and mental wellbeing. The college transition coaches engage with students through campus visits and virtual encounters. Students' progress toward earning a degree is monitored for six years.

The Future Leaders Internship Program (FLIP) is our new initiative to provide college juniors and seniors with unique internship opportunities at local and national corporations to help launch their careers and retain valuable young talent in our community.

#### The Whitney M. Young Leadership Initiative has a proven track record:

- 3.25 average GPA for high school Class of 2024
- 100% annual high school graduation
- \$15 million in total scholarship awards in 2023 & 2024
- \$242,000 average scholarship award per scholar since 2023
- 175+ scholars currently enrolled at accredited colleges or universities


